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
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1.0 THE HOTEL

The Bracken Hide Hotel

This new four star resort hotel will connect our guests to the magic of the Island and the nature that abounds while providing seamless service and a matchless eye for design. Sitting snugly into the environment the main hotel building (The Hub) will be complemented by 27 luxury en-suite Cabins which will sit scattered across the landscape. They will be a perfect retreat for guests. The Hub will have a large reception and entrance area complete with a full size lemon tree.

The smart restaurant will have large, landscape windows and contemporary design creating picture views across Portree and the harbour beyond. In addition there will be a Whisky Bar with feature fireplace which will make the perfect place to relax after a day exploring the wonders of Skye. In addition there will be a family lounge with games and a screening room.

4.0 THE HUB BUILDING


Materiality

Concept

The heart of any good hotel is the communal facilities, including the entrance space, lobby and restaurant/bar. It is a unique feature in this project that the rooms and the communal spaces are in separate buildings, meaning that the hub becomes a stand alone piece that sets the tone for the rest of the site.

We believe that the most evocative feature of this development is the site, perched on a hill overlooking the town of Portree, the bustling centre of Skye. The look and feel of the interior space is to build on this by creating a theme of the contemporary bothy, which a material palette that is **rich, wild and raw**. From the moment you enter into the courtyard the feeling is of grandeur, yet comfort. It acts as a teaser for the further rooms inside the building that take inspiration from the landscape in terms of tone, texture and touch. The concept of the building is about blades cutting into the landscape and framing the amazing view, the concept of the interiors is about landscape and nature creeping into the building.


Ground Floor Plan



Fireplace

The double ended fireplace chosen is due to the way it fits into the opening, the heat output and flexibility of use. A concrete plinth will be designed to hold the fireplace, with logs stored underneath.


Joinery

The centre of the space will incorporate a feature tree consisting of a real (petrified) bark base and fake, autumnal leaves, approximately 5m high.




The bronze blades will incorporate three openings adjoining the fireplaces to accommodate fireplace accessories, logs, books and other items. They are to be designed in proportion to the other openings in the blades of the courtyard. This is to create a more homely feel in such a grand space and at the human scale create a sense of warmth and cosiness.






Courtyard Shelving - Layouts and Items



Reception Desk and Wall

The reception desk and wall is to be a free-standing fluted timber piece that subtly works with the courtyard space and integrate with the rear wall, which will consist of timber panels running up to the windows above.



As the floor has a unique pattern, we want the tables and chairs to work with it to create a vibrant and unique space.




Restaurant - Joinery & Planting

Joinery and Planting

The planting in the restaurant is a key feature within the space and will be embedded between the seating, set within planter boxes. The are to be specially designed and sourced to fit within the grid pattern of the room and allow the diner to feel as if nature has crept inside the space. Most planters will be sitting head height to create this feeling, in a timber or bronze planter box.




The seating and tables in the lounge will be of a light colour variety to contrast with the natural tones of the space.





Joinery




Lounge - Bay Window

Bar

The bar is the feature element of the whisky room, with the bar feature wall as the centrepiece. Once you enter the room the unique timber floor pattern leads you to the showcase bar, which is sunken down so that guest can interact with the bar staff sitting down at eye-level.






Bar - Tile Pattern






5.0 The cabins

Cabin Exterior

The accommodation for the Bracken Hide Hotel are unique and distinct luxury cabins spread across the site to the west of the Hub building. There will be 32 luxury cabin rooms which will snuggle neatly within the rugged and wild hillside with beautiful views out across Loch Portree and the Sound of Raasay. They are timber framed and will provide a cosy retreat from the wild landscape of Skye. The Hub is a hive of activity while the cabins will be a place of relaxation and peace.


Cabin Interior

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Expertly crafted to maximise comfort and splendour, they have been designed to evoke the natural landscape with a rich palette of materials that aim to generate a sense of warmth and calm. Each cabin room has a double bed, a smart en-suite shower room, underfloor heating and a Harris Tweed headboard to create an elegant and beautiful space in which to rest and admire the stunning views across Skye.

6.0 OUTDOOR AND SITE FEATURES

The Sauna

Evoking the traditional Nordic themes of relaxation and detoxing, the Bracken Hide Hotel will have an on-site Finnish-style sauna and outdoor plunge pool to be used by all guests, adjacent to the Hub Building.

Primary and Secondary Paths

Design Criteria

Paths (Pedestrian):

The pedestrian path (desire line) is to be finished with a light gravel stones (with underlay to prevent gravel from sliding downhill) and intermittent stone or concrete steps where necessary. All paths are to be built with permeable surfaces as per the SUDS strategy and in accordance with the SNH Countryside Access Design Guide.

Paths (Vehicular):

The vehicular path will be a hard resin of sufficient minimum width (for vehicles and bicycles, with a lay-by that leads up to the Hub Building and wraps around the back up to the disabled car park and the service compound to the north.

Lighting:

The pedestrian path and the straight desire line will have sufficiently, yet subtle lighting along the side of the paths. They will be a simple, slender modern light fixture with a bronze finish. The vehicular path will not incorporate lighting.

Signage:

The wayfinding signposts up to the Hub Building will be designed as bronze way-markers, subtly set into the landscape and lit up at night.

Connection with Landscape

The forms and materials of the design are informed by the surrounding natural landscape. Materials are kept as natural as possible. Wild grass is used on the roof of the hub and sauna buildings. This is complemented by drystone cladding which will follow the rolling form of the building. Earthy tones have been selected both inside and out to keep the design rooted to its context.

The building has been made to appear as though it has been uprooted from the landscape it sits on.



The Hub - Entrance


Design Criteria

An important aspect of the Hub Building is the sense of 'arrival'. From the moment you come from Struan Road and the car park, you are lead up a gravel path towards the hub of the development. Once you hit the crossroad at the top, first time visitors will make their way to the right and down the rear of the Hub Building between the stone facade of the building and retaining wall towards the main entrance at the centre. It is there that an imposing entrance door hides what is behind, not giving away the scale of the spaces inside.

The Hub - Outdoor Terrace

Design Criteria

The outdoor terrace will be a sheltered space for guest of the hotel and visitors to the restaurant and bar to use for outdoor leisure and a smoking space. The general look and feel of this space will be of natural colours (stone and timber) that reflect the Hub Building and use the dry stone to create the walls to shelter from the elements. The outdoor terrace is situated to the rear of the building because it creates a natural sheltered space from the elements of the site but without ruining the shape and form of the main building.




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The Hub - Roofscape

Design Criteria

The roofscape of the building will consist of primarily the dry stone walling curving up to make the pitch of the roof and a semi-intensive green roof facing the east. The green roof will primarily be from the ground from which the building stands, taking the rich flora and colours from the site and lifting it onto the roof.
